So we have some big events coming up in the next couple weeks.

This update I think will kind of be A tag team between me and Dom, probably, and Rance, if you're able.

I was hoping maybe could share some of the registration information in a in a minute those numbers.

Sorry, I didn't read out.

Reach out to you in advance, but so let's talk about the dates of the upcoming

regional town halls.

As a reminder, these are for.

Gathering input from stakeholders in the emergency responder community.

Emergency communications and state and local officials.

Communities.

So there will be 4 regional town halls.

Umm the first is September 11th, so next Wednesday in Swanton from 5:00 to 7:00 PM.

The very next day we'll have one at the Fire Academy from noon to two at the Fire Academy in Pittsford.

On the following week, in the following week, on the 17th will be at NVRH, the hospital at St Johnsbury from 8:00 to 10:00 AM, and on the 19th will be down in Springfield for an evening session from 5:00 to 7:00 PM.

So as I mentioned the the focus group here is the emergency responder community and state and local officials and communications personnel.

We we can have for each regional town hall, we can have up to three task force members in attendance.

So what I would like to do is reach out to everyone after the meeting to understand what your availability is and then I can work through with Jen Morrison and or Paul White to make sure we've got the so you appropriate number of people going to each of the meetings.

So perhaps you can watch for that email from either myself or Cali.

If she's able to help me out with that.

So we we do want to stress that it's important to be clear with everyone at these meetings that there's no predetermined outcome here and that their input is vitally important.

So we had a meeting yesterday with rants and the mission critical team to kind of dig into the content of the regional town halls.

We're going to start with some introductory comments by a task Force member that is present.

If she's doing this particular session or that may be another task Force member depending on which session we're we're doing, uh, I I will be providing project update with you know an overview of what items we're we're currently pursuing the general process and then do a schedule update and then turn it over to mission critical partners and and their team and will identify the specific team members. It'll be facilitating each particular session, and they will.

They're putting a lot of their content right now into this format, but we'll essentially be reviewing the the process will key questions we have and of course having hopefully the majority of the meeting will be discussion.

And then indicate what the follow up is and the key questions will focus on high level discussions.

Certainly, initially things such as what is working well today with the dispatch process, what is not working and you know what are some of the key priorities that the stakeholders would like to see out of the coming out of the process and out of any potential future dispatch dispatch system and also potentially what deal Breakers there might be that would have them hesitant to support a new future system. So that's essentially what we have at this point.

Those that's in draft form, of course, but it's currently being updated with the specific content from Mission critical partners and other items.

So there will be some whiteboarding where we'll be taking some information and putting it on a whiteboard.

So you can see that as we're having discussion live.

There may be even some we're still kind of toying around with, you know, a type of a polling or a, you know, a gathering information to be able to see, you know, what kind of responses we get from people, especially if they're not physically there.

That will help us be able to pull their information into that and then just go through some questions to be able to prompt some conversation.

So we can get us an idea about what everybody's feeling out there in the in for the entire state when we get done.

That was part of the original discussion with First night on the broadband.

So wherever they're building towers, public safety should have access.

I'm pretty sure that's how the government finalize their agreement with them.

I would like to hear more discussion about that topic just raised by Senator Renner at Kim and Kim Chaney has always been an advocate for focusing on the governance but it it seems like these workshops were almost designed to keep me from speaking.

And informing the folks of all the stuff that this task force refuses to deal with, which is regional governance, which is near term interoperability and failover, because we do, we are at risk right now big time and we're proceeding along on a, you know, concept of a options for a statewide design, some, you know, it definite budget in the future rather than work with what we've got and figure out how to pair these piece apps to each other and have full functioning CAD and records management interoperable among them.

And to have raised these issues and and then there's the confidentiality of information.

You know, there's no way you'll prevail on trying to keep Central Vermont's information private because it's already been made public, you know.

But the fallacy of first net being our only option when most first responders don't subscribe the first act.

Nor does first net have the coverage that they claim they would build for us. Uh.

Is is really something that these are things that y'all should be talking about, and I don't know why it's it's, you know, Paul, I dare say it's worse than the 911 board. You know, I I counted on you to keep this task force.

You know broad and wide and engaged y'all are supposed to have direct oversight of the congressionally directed spending.

And your seem to be asleep at that switch.

You can't perpetuate this fallacy that you know \$9 million is going to be spent on a system that we don't have a design for that's going to support regional dispatch, and that's what the money was appropriated for.

So it you know, as far as I can tell from my record request, mission critical has yet to begin asking for the 901 tower data so that they could proceed with the LTE, the

economics of integrated LTE LMR design have not been discussed or prioritized. I mean, y'all are gonna be a real sitting duck.

I've heard from a key legislator that this thing continues to be off the rails and you know to be gathering 20 people to and keeping stakeholders like myself from speaking is not the way to get this thing back on track.

As we talked to last meeting, we had completed our initial round of dispatch center visits.

We were able to visit 30 out of the 38 dispatch centers and we are now in the process of analyzing the data that we've received from those visits as well as the completed questionnaires.

So that is ongoing.

We do have eight more dispatch centers that we need to visit, and MCP has been working to schedule those.

Those will be scheduled in at the same time frame as the uh town halls.

Now I'll show my schedule now.

Sorry, sorry about that.

So here's here's where we are at the end of at the end of August, we are performing analysis, as I mentioned of the data received and the primary other primary activity. As you've heard, uh at the first part of this meeting is planning the town halls. I did add a line item for the town halls to the schedule that hadn't previously been there, so that is their currently.

And as Barb mentioned, we have the four town hall scheduled over the next two week period and in that same two week period, mission critical Partners will complete their dispatch center visits and then we will complete the analysis based on that additional data.

Uh, so that that is currently where we are over the next couple of weeks, we're gonna do the town halls and consolidate that information and include that in our analysis and also utilize that towards the development of the inventory and assessment. One other item there that mission critical partners has a team focused on the wireless data gathering and wireless inventory and they are continuing to no compile that data.

They've analyzed existing information from current public safety systems, both types of systems, site locations, and they are utilizing the FCC database to gather further information and accumulate all of that.

So they can identify specific gap areas.

We have also talked with some particular stakeholders throughout the state, in particular that the town of Hardwick, for example, to identify their challenges and they have gap areas that they're dealing with.

They happen to be located in a in a valley and it's the difficult to cover or even their relatively small town.

But they're looking at options currently as to how to do that.

So that's primarily where we are.

We look forward to the town halls over the next couple of weeks and then we'll update from there.

OK, let's go then to an update from rants at mission critical.

We're kind of overlapping on those things right now, but we do our we have started some analysis, however can't get through all of it till we get obviously finish up some of these on site visits.

And then after the on site visit, we'll have more more of our team members actually getting into more the analysis to be able to try to to start developing, you know, pizzas of the report and recommendations and things like that.

So I just want to emphasize timelines to kind of think about we're kind of doing a a light analysis right now that will get more into it a little bit after that.

And to reiterate on the wireless side of it, they are they are looking all the radio communications, but I do want to add they are also looking at your, it's all you know cellular propagation as well whether it be first, net, Verizon, T-Mobile, whoever, all the service providers are.

So that is also another component of the wireless that want to make sure we emphasize that they're looking at both sides of the sometimes that's looked at is both sides of the house.

So you have the radio communication side also has the cell phone side which are very much can be very integrated now with public safety communications.

So that's one day I had.

expanding the audience, so to speak, to include more people rather than less and and these are just initial thoughts.

The regional town halls have been geared towards all along the stakeholder group. That includes the field responders, the emergency communications personnel and the leadership at all of those entities and also state and local government officials. The community and that group must be prioritized, ought to be rightfully as prioritized in the regional town halls.

We also have these community listening sessions which will be added to the calendar soon.

We'll get to work on that, which I think may be a better, a better forum for stakeholders outside of that group that, that the town halls are geared towards. So when the invitations went out, I believe Jen sent out the bulk of them. I'm pretty sure it included in the in the subject line to distribute far and wide to. Folks that might be interested in these, so I would I would encourage people outside that core group that we mentioned earlier to think about attending the Community listening sessions once we get them up on the on the board and or or on the schedule and know that that will be an opportunity for the broader audience to have input.

So I'm like I said, those are my initial thoughts.

I think that we are.

We are doing our best to give multiple opportunities for input from stakeholders all across the board.

And anyway, I'll I'll open it up now to see if there's any comments from umm from the task force or our partners.

But we kind of need to keep those in a separate conversation because of there's many different needs.


